Tokyo Metropolitan Greening Fund

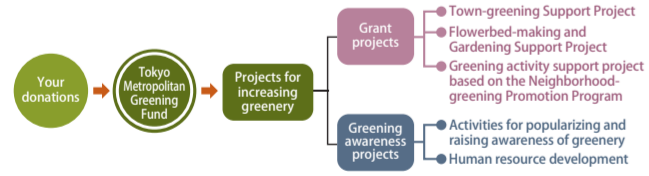

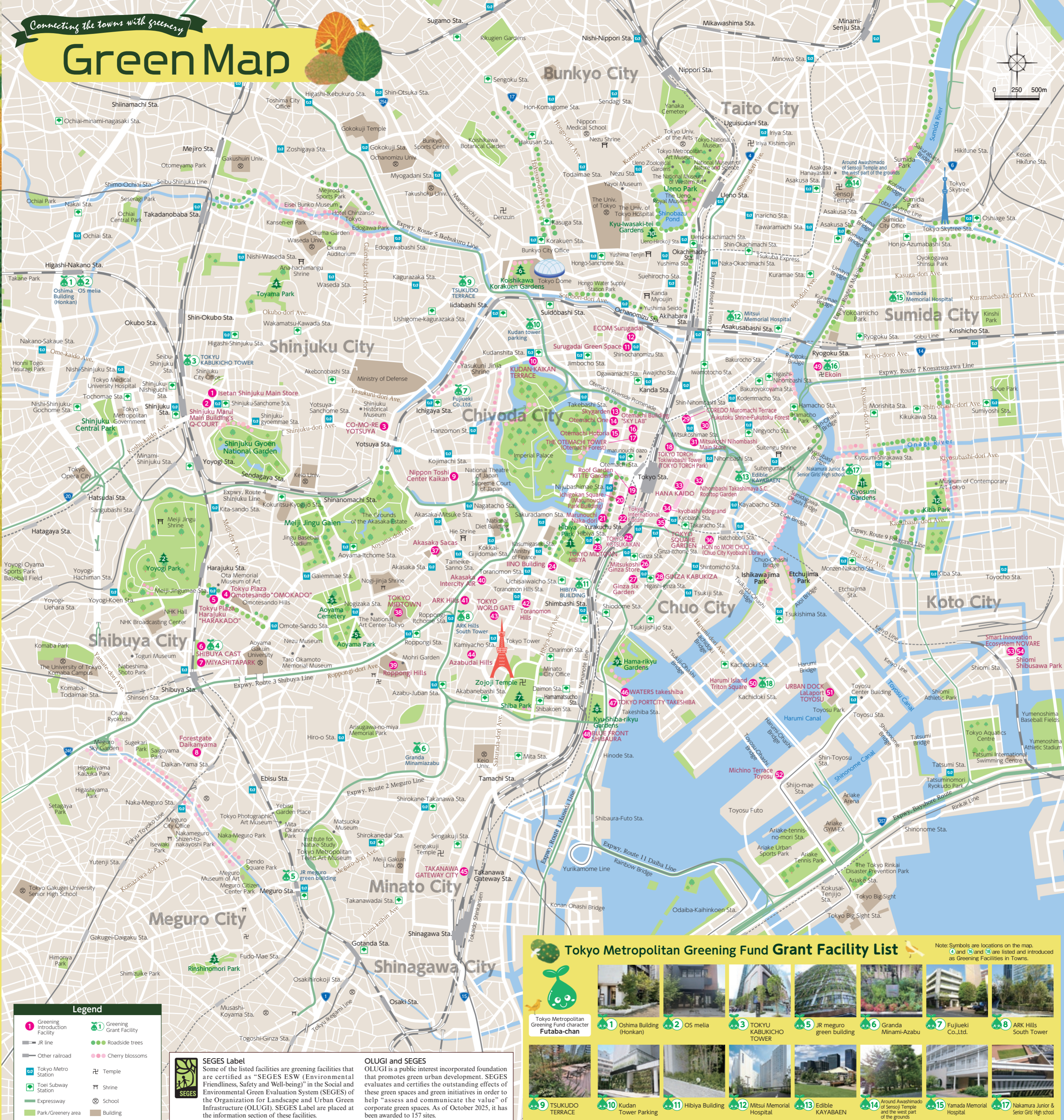

SEGES Label

Some of the listed facilities are greening facilities that are certified as "SEGES ESW (Environmental Friendliness, Safety and Well-being)" in the Social and Environmental Green Evaluation System (SEGES) of the Organization for Landscape and Urban Green Infrastructure (OLUGI). SEGES Label are placed at the information section of these facilities.

OLUGI and SEGES

OLUGI is a public interest incorporated foundation that promotes green urban development. SEGES evaluates and certifies the outstanding effects of these green spaces and green initiatives in order to help "assess and communicate the value" of corporate green spaces. As of October 2025, it has been awarded to 157 sites.

A New Green Town, Starting from the Train Station



A town directly connected to Takanawa Gateway Station. You can enjoy the landscape and the changing seasons at the plaza.

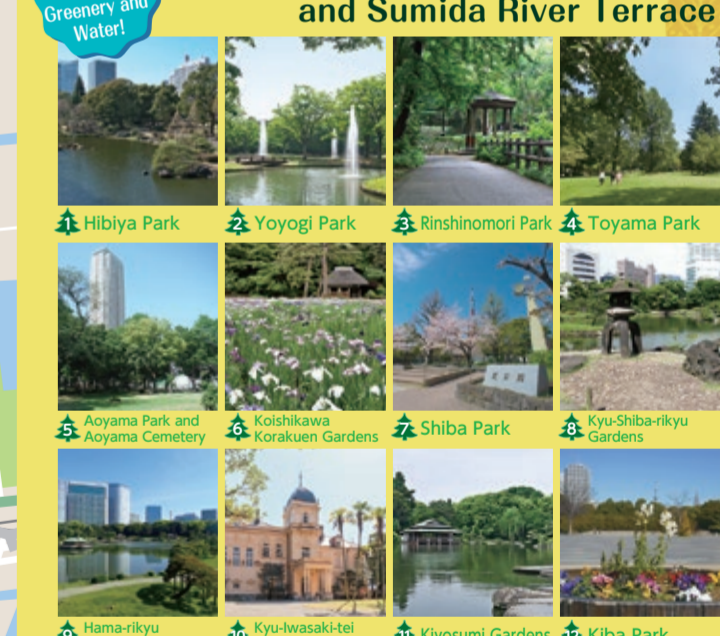


The town stretches approximately 1 km from north to south, and is connected by pedestrian-only promenade, creating a relaxing space where people can spend time in their own way.

15 TAKANAWA GATEWAY CITY

Directly connected to Takanawa Gateway Station and spanning approximately 1km north to south between the Shinjogawa and Tamachi areas, a large-scale urban development is underway, integrating the station, residences, offices, and a multi-purpose cultural complex. Based on the themes of environment, mobility, and healthcare, this new type of town features waterfront environments and lush greenery. It is designed with biodiversity in mind, making it both nature-rich and eco-friendly. In spring 2026, the construction of a cultural complex, "MoN Takanawa: The Museum of Narratives" will be completed.

Sumida River Terrace

Sumida River Terrace is a waterfront facility along both banks of the Sumida River. Most of the 12-kilometer stretch from Kachidokishi Bridge at the downstream end to Minami-Senju is a promenade where you can enjoy a walk along the river. The sound of the flowing water and the sight of the colorful flower beds bring enjoyment to all five of the senses.

Recommendation 1

The Okawaba walking course starts at Monzen-nakacho Station, passes through St. Luke's Garden, and ends at Kachidokishi Bridge downstream.

Recommendation 2

This walking course covers the Hananori Flower beds and Ryogoku. It starts at Kuramaebashi Bridge and ends at Ryogokubashi Bridge and the surrounding area.

Shinjuku City & Shibuya City

Isetan Shinjuku Main Store I-GARDEN 1

They consist of a peaceful garden with a spacious lawn area and a garden surrounded by about 350 species of plants, including cherry trees and Japanese maple. Enjoy the lovely transformation of seasons reflected in the trees and plants in village forests.




SHIBUYA CAST 6

Seasonal trees, such as symbolic fir and cherry trees, are planted in the entrance plaza. Around the shrubbery are attractive white benches where people can relax.



Shinjuku Marui Main Building's Q-COURT 2

The authentic English-style garden is composed of five unique areas where you can enjoy the sunlight and breezes and spend time relaxing surrounded by seasonal flowers.



MIYASHITAPARK 7

MIYASHITA PARK was reborn on the rooftop of the MIYASHITA PARK Complex as an open space with a promenade circling along a part of the green canopy that includes sports facilities and a grass plaza.



CO-MO-RE YOTSUYA 3

A stepped nature which constructed integration with the building forms scenery of lush green. It is connected to the green tract of land and outer moat of Yotsuya. Passage which is connected to the entrance square and the circle square (square of CO-MO-RE-BI) entices your steps from station to the nature.



Forestgate Daikanyama 8

This complex consisting of two buildings, the MAIN building and the wooden TENOHA building, features the themes of "green and environmental sustainability" and "food." You can feel the presence of greenery throughout the complex, and enjoy a pleasant time at restaurants and cafes overlooking lush green atrium spaces.



Tokyu Plaza Omotesando "OMOKADO" 4

The free space on the sixth floor welcomes you with trees that suggest a change of seasons including Zelkova, the symbol of the Omotesando/Harajuku area, creating a relaxing and comfortable space for you.



Forestgate Daikanyama 8

This complex consisting of two buildings, the MAIN building and the wooden TENOHA building, features the themes of "green and environmental sustainability" and "food." You can feel the presence of greenery throughout the complex, and enjoy a pleasant time at restaurants and cafes overlooking lush green atrium spaces.



Tokyu Plaza Harajuku "HARAKADO" 5

This complex was created as a hub for diverse and unique cultural creation and promotion. Its charm lies in the open, green, terraced space that leads to the rooftop terrace on the 7th floor. The greenery of the two buildings, "Omokado" and "Harakado," located at the Jinguumei intersection, contributes to the green landscape stretching from Meiji Jingu Shrine to Omotesando.



Forestgate Daikanyama 8

This complex consisting of two buildings, the MAIN building and the wooden TENOHA building, features the themes of "green and environmental sustainability" and "food." You can feel the presence of greenery throughout the complex, and enjoy a pleasant time at restaurants and cafes overlooking lush green atrium spaces.



Chiyoda City - Otemachi

Nippon Toshi Center Kaikan 9

On the south side is an undulating plaza with Japanese apricot trees belonging to the Hirakawa Tenmangji Shrine, and on the north side is a promenade where walkers can enjoy the colored foliage of Japanese apricots, cherry blossoms, zelkova and other seasonal plants.



Otemachi Hotoria 15

The thicket of trees that includes camphor and sawtooth oak extends outward to meet the greenery of the Imperial Palace. You can relax on a bench or in a cafe, surrounded by trees with a stream running through them.



KUDAN-KAIKAN TERRACE 10

The former Kudan Kaikan was rebuilt and renovated with partial preservation and restoration. The "Terrace along the Moat" and the rooftop garden along Ushigafuchi provide a space for rest and relaxation. Kudan Komichi leads to Uchibori Street, encouraging a circular stroll.



Otemachi Building "SKY LAB" 16

The Otemachi Building, completed in 1958, was extensively renovated to create a 4,000 square meter rooftop featuring a workspace overflowing with greenery, a farm space for users to join in with growing vegetables, and the Otemachi Kannon space. You can visit some of them free of charge by downloading an app.



Surugadai Green Space 11 / ECOM Surugadai 12

Surugadai Green Space is a green space located on the premises of Mitau Sumitomo Insurance. Native plant species are grown to preserve biodiversity, and wild birds often visit the rooftop garden, which is open to the public. The adjacent ECOM Surugadai hosts special exhibitions related to living creatures and the environment.



THE OTEMACHI TOWER (Otemachi Forest) 17

Based on the concept of restoring the natural environment, tall trees and forest-floor plants have been planted. The greenery forms a "true forest" in a central business district.



Skygarden 13

In the Sky Garden on the fourth floor, a stream, paddy fields and a shrine were created to replicate the scenery of a village forest. You can while away the time in the garden listening to the sounds of the stream.



TOKYO TORCH Tokiwabashi Tower (TOKYO TORCH Park) 18

On the Tokyo Station side is a lively facade of buildings and greenery. Along the Nihonbashi River is a waterfront space lined with native flora. We are striving to promote the appeal of the area, in cooperation with local governments across the country.



Otemachi One 14

This comprises seven green spaces covering 6,000 square meters with a luxurious grass area and a shaded space for a small group to gather. The garden supports the area environment by creating a cool spot in the heart of the city and enhancing carbon neutrality and biodiversity while playing a role in living up to the neighborhood.



TOKYO TORCH Tokiwabashi Tower (TOKYO TORCH Park) 18

On the Tokyo Station side is a lively facade of buildings and greenery. Along the Nihonbashi River is a waterfront space lined with native flora. We are striving to promote the appeal of the area, in cooperation with local governments across the country.

Roof Garden "KITTE Garden" 19

The rooftop garden on the sixth floor of the JP Tower's "KITTE" complex faces the Marunouchi building of Tokyo Station, with a view of arriving and departing trains. It has an open grassy area where you can enjoy the refreshing breezes.



IINO Building 24

To preserve the biodiversity of Tokyo, "IINO Forest" creates a rich natural environment that is composed of native species, including cherry trees that are the cherry trees of Garyu Zakura and Shokawa Zakura.



Ichigokan Square (Marunouchi Park Building) 20

The characteristic feature of the plaza is its roses, which were loved by Josiah Conder, the designer of the Mitsubishi No. 1 Building. Three round columns are colorfully decorated with 20 kinds of plants.




TOKYO KOTSUKAIKAN 25

The "Yurakucho Colline" rooftop garden is a metropolitan oasis where people can spend time relaxing and contemplating a journey while watching the bullet trains.



Marunouchi Naka-dori 21

The street is a zelkova-lined avenue of about 1.2km in length from Eitai-dori Ave. to Harumi-dori Ave. During the vehicle-free time, you can relax in an open cafe.



Mitsukoshi Ginza Store Ginza terrace 26

A space for relaxation with a view of the lawn and plants. The flowerbeds are filled with seasonal colors, gifting you with the beauty of each season.



Tokyo International Forum 22

"Plaza" on the ground between the Glass Building and the Hall Buildings serves as an event space surrounded by the thicket of trees where people can relax and enjoy exciting times.



Ginza six Garden 27

This rooftop garden is an oasis in Ginza. Here, you can escape the hustle and bustle of urban life and enjoy a 360-degree panoramic view of the city while feeling the changes of seasons around you.



TOKYO MIDTOWN HIBIYA 23

The lush greenery of the "Park View Garden" on an upper floor creates the illusion of extending towards the "Hibiya park" below, thereby harmonizing the landscape with the surrounding area.



GINZA KABUKIZA 28

In the Japanese garden on the large roof of Kabukiza Theatre, you can enjoy the seasons thanks to the cherry blossoms, maples and seasonal plants. Ishi-oro (lanterns made of stone) and monuments related to kabuki are installed to create a traditional atmosphere.



Around Nihonbashi & Kyobashi

COREDO Muromachi Terrace 29

Based on the idea of creating a forest of various kinds of Japanese trees, cherry trees, maples, zelkova and other Japanese trees are planted. You can enjoy many varieties of cherry blossoms from mid-March to late April.



HANA KAIDO 33

Three times a year, the town council, businesses, and merchant associations work together to plant seasonal flowers in the flower beds along the Chuo-dori Avenue to brighten up the streetscape which stretches for approximately 2 kilometers from Shin-Nihonbashi Station to Kyobashi Station. This photo shows the "Flower Plaza" at the southern end of the famous Nihonbashi Bridge.



kyobashi edogrand 34

When exiting Kyobashi subway station, you will be impressed by the wide-open well-greened space. The terrace seats on the third floor have a relaxing atmosphere with green vegetation for a pleasing view.



TOKYO SQUARE GARDEN 35

From the first basement to the fifth floor is a mixed planting of around 140 types of trees, constituting the "Hill of Kyobashi." Cherry blossoms in spring and maple and ginkgo leaves in fall create seasonal scenery.



Fukutoku Shrine Fukutoku Forest 30

Together with a more than 1,000m² plaza next to COREDO Muromachi, the garden serves as a base where people can interact with each other and newly establish a local community. 2-5-1 Nihonbashi-Muromachi, Chuo-ku



HON no MORI CHUO (Chuo City Kyobashi Library) 36

The promenade from the side of the main entrance along the stairs to the Greenery Space for Gathering on the second floor is lined with plants and benches, leading directly to the library entrance. There are also terrace seats in the Rooftop Garden, where you can read books and enjoy the greenery, feeling the pleasant harmony between the two experiences.



Mitsukoshi Nihonbashi Main Store Nihonbashi Garden 31

Its base concept is "a forest of connections." In the spacious rooftop garden, you can directly experience the changes in nature brought about by the seasons and different weather conditions. (Food and drink facilities are open for a limited period.)



AKASAKA Intercity AIR 40

The area of greenery was created to resemble the scenery of a natural village forest. Beside a tree-lined avenue are shady areas and water features. Enjoying the season, you can relax in a cafe or on a bench.



Nihonbashi Takashimaya S.C. Rooftop Garden 32

The rooftop garden locates over the main building, the annex and the east building which is connected with sky bridges. It is composed of various elements such as a rose garden, fountain and Japanese garden. Eating facilities are also established.



ARK Hills 41

As seen from trees on the rooftop of Suntory Hall, this developed area harmonize with the greenery of more than 40,000 planted trees. The outer roads are famous for the 131 cherry trees of Somiyoshi.



Around Akasaka, Roppongi & Minato City

Akasaka Sacas 37

It aims at preserving and passing on the remembrance of the Akasaka area. Four hundred tall trees create a colorful seasonal view. For two months in the heart of the spring, people can enjoy various kinds of cherry blossoms.



Toronomon Hills 42

As the intersection of the north-south greenery line from Hibiya Park to Mt. Atago and the east-west greenery line of Shintora-dori Ave., a green area and streams are established to tempt birds and other wild animals to the site.



TOKYO MIDTOWN 38

Roppongi's iconic spacious green area protects the environment and also serves as a place where people can relax. In an emergency, it is used for disaster-prevention activities.



TOKYO WORLD GATE 43

"Fukushiro-no-Mori" is a forest featuring greenery with local native species and a biotope designed to promote biodiversity. With a flowing stream and the soothing sounds of water and birds, this cozy space creates a vibrant experience for residents, visitors, and workers.



Roppongi Hills 39

There are enjoy the unique greenery of Roppongi-Kyattakita-dori Ave. with its colorful flowers and plants, the rooftop rice paddies of Keyakizaka Complex and the Mohri Garden, which is imbued with a sense of history.



Azabudai Hills 44

This facility is set amid lush greenery that takes advantage of the hilly terrain, allowing visitors to experience a "Modern Urban Village" as a town designed like a plaza that connects people. Beside the 6,000-square-meter central plaza with lawn areas and watercourses, there is also an orchard where you can experience the colors of all four seasons.



AKASAKA Intercity AIR 40

The area of greenery was created to resemble the scenery of a natural village forest. Beside a tree-lined avenue are shady areas and water features. Enjoying the season, you can relax in a cafe or on a bench.



TAKANAWA GATEWAY CITY 45

Visitors can clear their minds and reflect on their lives in a bamboo garden located above the first-floor hall of Nembutsu Hall.



Waterfront

WATERS takeshiba 46

The facility complex has a pier along with a tideland where Tokyo Bay's diverse aquatic species live. With culture and the arts at its core, an urban development effort is underway to make the most of the waterside.



Harumi Island Triton Square 60

In an open space with more than 600 kinds of plants, office workers and residents form communities and hold various events.



TOKYO PORTCITY TAKESHIBA 47

The "New Eight Views of Takeshiba" highlights the site's unique characteristics of "rain, water, islands, paddy fields, incense, vegetable gardens, bees, and the sky" to express our biodiversity conservation initiatives.



URBAN DOCK LaLaport TOYOSU 51

The "Biogarden" in the large shopping center provides opportunities for children to develop an interest in nature and think about the importance of preserving diversity.



BLUE FRONT SHIBAURA 48

BLUE FRONT SHIBAURA, which is located in the heart of the city, offers open waterfront spaces with rich nature, such as greenery, a canal, and the Port of Tokyo. The "GREEN WALK" which connects Hamamatsucho Station and the Shibaura area, is a lush green approach surrounded by approximately 200 trees.



Michino Terrace Toyosu 52

The facility complex in the Toyosu Market consists of an office building and a hotel with a natural hot spring. A green deck between the two buildings offers a pleasant retreat, with perimeters and walls lushly landscaped with greenery. The waterfront hotel has a park along the canal.



Ekoin 49

Visitors can clear their minds and reflect on their lives in a bamboo garden located above the first-floor hall of Nembutsu Hall.



Smart Innovation Ecosystem NOVARE 53

The "NOVARE Walk" is a promenade designed to harmonize with the lush greenery surrounding "Smart Innovation Ecosystem NOVARE" in front of Shiomi Station (open from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on facility operating days). It is a new retreat spot that not only supports health but inspires creativity and new ideas as well.



Shiomi Shibusawa Park 54

Along the canal, there is an accessible walkway with ramps, allowing visitors to spend a pleasant time while enjoying the sea breeze. Over the stone walls, you can catch a glimpse of the relocated former residence of Eiichi Shibusawa.
